**1. SUBJECT: RATIFICATION OF PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL
COUNTY-WIDE EMERGENCY (DISTRICTS: ALL)**

OVERVIEW:

On February 3, 2017, the Chief Administrative Officer, serving as the County's Director of Emergency Services and as Coordinator of the Unified San Diego County Emergency Services Organization, issued a Proclamation of Local Emergency as a result of the flooding in multiple locations throughout the County due to a series of severe winter storms. The Proclamation was issued pursuant to San Diego County Code of Regulatory Ordinances sections 31.101 et seq. and California Government Code section 8630. The Proclamation asked the Governor to grant California Disaster Assistance Act funds for response, recovery and mitigation costs associated with the series of storms that started January 18, 2017 and for the Governor to request a federal Major Disaster Declaration. Gov. Code section 8630(b) requires that the Board of Supervisors ratify Proclamations of Local Emergency within seven days of being issued. This is a request for the Board of Supervisors to (1) ratify the Proclamation, (2) find that there is a need for continuing the local emergency until no longer needed subject to statutory review requirements.
