

COOPERATIVE *PHYTOPHTHORA RAMORUM* QUARANTINE PROJECT
EXHIBIT X- NURSERY STOCK
Provisions for the Intrastate and Interstate Movement of
Regulated Nursery Stock from Regulated Counties

Establishment agrees to the following:

1. Inspection and Sampling of Nursery Stock

Establishment shall allow the Project to inspect and sample nursery stock as defined in 7 CFR 301.92-11(C). The following plants must be withheld from interstate shipment until the testing is completed and the nursery is found free of evidence of *Phytophthora ramorum*: 1) all symptomatic plants; 2) any plants located in the same lot as the suspect plant; and, 3) any plants located within 2 meters of the lot of plants.

2. Shipping Period

Establishment may move nursery stock interstate from the date the above inspection is completed, including laboratory analysis of plant material, for a period of up to one year or until directed otherwise by the Project.

3. Restriction on Sources of Regulated Articles

Establishment may only receive plants from sources within the quarantined or regulated areas under the following conditions:

- a. Plants listed in Exhibit A2 must be accompanied by an appropriate state or USDA quarantine certificate or stamp for *Phytophthora ramorum*.
- b. Plants not listed in Exhibit A2 must originate from nurseries that have been inspected and found free of *P. ramorum* and are on an official list maintained by state agricultural officials.
- c. Plants that do not meet the criteria above must be segregated, safeguarded, and held off sale until they have been inspected and released by the Project.

Establishment shall maintain a record of receipt and/or a bill of lading for all plants received from sources outside of quarantined or regulated areas for 24 months.

4. Maintain Identity

Establishment shall maintain the identity of all plants listed in Exhibit A2 that are in compliance with Provision 1. Establishment shall maintain the identity of all plants that originated from sources in quarantined or regulated areas that are in compliance with provisions 3A or 3B.

5. Requirements for Interstate Movement

Establishment shall ensure that a USDA quarantine certificate or stamp accompanies each shipment of plants listed in Exhibit A2 moved interstate. Plants listed in Exhibit A2 may only be moved interstate when in accordance with 7 CFR 301.92-8.

Establishment shall ensure that plants not listed in Exhibit A2 originate from a source in a quarantined or regulated area that is on an official list maintained by State agricultural officials.

Establishment may move plants listed in Exhibit A2 interstate with a USDA quarantine certificate or stamp when the plants have been inspected and sampled in accordance with Provision 1.

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6. Records

Establishment shall maintain production records or records of receipt for all plants moved interstate. Establishment shall maintain records, as directed by the Project, on each interstate shipment of plants listed in Exhibit A2. Establishment shall provide such records to the Project Officer once every 30 days, or as specified by the Project Officer. Establishment shall allow the Project to perform periodic inspections to verify compliance with this Provision.

7. Infected Nursery Stock

If any plant within a nursery is found to be infected with *Phytophthora ramorum*, Establishment shall not move any plants, as defined in the USDA Confirmed Nursery Protocol, interstate until such time as the Project can determine that the nursery is free of *Phytophthora ramorum*.

8. Notice

Establishment shall provide at least 48 hours notice to the Project Officer when requesting an inspection.

9. Pre-notification Requirement

Establishment shall provide advance notification of outgoing shipments of any species of the genera *Camellia*, *Kalmia*, *Pieris*, *Rhododendron* (including Azalea), and *Viburnum* shipped to receiving States in non-regulated areas (all states except Oregon and Washington) effective March 1, 2011. This applies to all interstate shipping nurseries in regulated counties (affected counties listed below) with one or more interstate shippers that have tested positive for *P. ramorum* since 2003.

This requirement may be fulfilled by sending to the State Plant Health Regulatory Official (SPRO) in the receiving state (via mail, facsimile, or email) a bill of sale, manifest or other documentation that includes the following information: Shipping date, contact name, telephone number, full address of the consignee, name, telephone number and address of the shipper, Plant name and number of each plant species/variety shipped, and mode of transportation (air, courier, ground).
