Explanation of Fees

Permit Fee – The fee as set forth in County of San Diego Code of Regulatory Ordinances, Title 6, Division 5, Chapter 1, required when application is made for a permit for an activity for which a permit is required.

Monitoring Well Re-inspection – When Monitoring Well Program staff conduct inspections and find wells that need corrections or repairs in the field, they send a written notice to the responsible parties and their consultants notifying them that repairs are required within a certain time frame. When the confirmation inspection is conducted and it is determined that the repairs have **not** been made, a follow-up inspection (re-inspection) is required. A re-inspection fee will be charged for follow-up inspections to confirm corrections have been made.

Investigative Fee – This is a fee to recover costs to investigate when it is discovered that work that required a permit was done without a permit. In addition to the original permit fee, the County will collect an investigative fee equal to 100% of the permit fees.

Soil Vapor Survey Fee – This is a flat fee per site. It includes the installation and destruction of soil vapor probes during the time when the permit is valid.

Tank Monitoring Well Fee (Enhanced Leak Detection) – This is a flat fee for borings installed in underground storage tank and piping backfill with casing installed for purposes of monitoring tank systems for leaks.

Miscellaneous Monitoring Well Program Fee – This includes refund requests, fee variances, and other Monitoring Well Program activities where no fee is specifically indicated. The charge is based on the staff time spent on the activity at the current hourly rate.

Permit Extension Fee – Permits are valid for 120 days and can be extended for 120 days a maximum of two times. Permit extensions must be requested while the permit is still valid.

Existing Monitoring Wells – Monitoring Well Program staff will look for existing wells, as time allows, when they conduct inspections for the installation of new monitoring wells and the destruction of monitoring wells. They will note any deficiencies at that time and require that the monitoring wells be repaired. If the wells are no longer being used, they will work with the responsible party to get the permit for the proper destruction of the wells.
