BOARD OF SUPERVISORS POLICIES RELATED TO WASTEWATER/SEWER ISSUES

Policy No.	Title	Description
E-16	Cleaning and Repair of Sewer Laterals	When sewer lateral does not properly drain, property owner is responsible for repair or replacement.
I-36	Prohibition of Sewer Extensions and Connections in Areas Not Annexed to the San Diego County Sanitation District	Properties must be annexed into the District to receive sewer service.
I-48	Extending Sewer Lines Within the San Diego County Sanitation District	Construction of sewer extensions within the District is to be done by private contract.
I-51	Connection to Interceptor Sewers Within the San Diego County Sanitation District	Connections to interceptor sewers can be growth inducing – must be in conformance with General Plan.
I-78	Small Wastewater Treatment Facilities	Prohibits sewer facilities that would induce unplanned growth – proposals to conform with General Plan.
I-84	Project Facility Availability and Commitment for Public Sewer, Water, School and Fire Services	Prior to intake of projects by Planning & Development Services, sewer and other utility service availability must be demonstrated.
I-91	Policy for Use of Irrevocable Letters of Credit in Lieu of Cash Payments for Sewer Capacity Commitments for Major Subdivisions Within the San Diego County Sanitation District	Use of irrevocable letters of credit in lieu of cash payments for sewer capacity commitments for major subdivisions within District.
I-99	Expenditure and Use of Revenue for Replacement and Improvement of San Diego County Sanitation District Facilities	Replacement reserves are to be segregated from improvement reserves.
I-113	Restrictions on Future Sewer Connections in the Julian Sewer Service Area of the San Diego County Sanitation District	Severe restrictions on future connections due to lack of capacity at Julian treatment plant.
I-135	Allocation of Excess Capacity in the Campo Water and Sewer Service Area	Limited remaining capacity in the Campo sewer and water system will be reserved for planned expansion of the “public” facilities.
