May 1 Last day for **policy committees** to hear and report to Fiscal Committees **fiscal bills** introduced in their house

May 15 Last day for **policy committees** to hear and report to the Floor **non-fiscal** bills introduced in their house

May 29 Last day for **fiscal committees** to hear and report to the Floor bills introduced in their house

June 5 Last day for bills to be **passed out of the house of origin**

June 15 Budget must be passed by **midnight**

July 17 Last day for **policy committees** to meet and report bills

Aug. 28 Last day for **fiscal committees** to meet and report bills to the Floor

Sept. 4 Last day to **amend** bills on the Floor

Sept. 11 Last day for **each house to pass bills**

- Priority Issues

The Priorities are the top issues for the County of San Diego. The priorities are usually also issues that we anticipate will be discussed in Sacramento and DC in the coming legislative session. Or, if there is no discussion, the County would press for the issue to be addressed. They include action statements to provide our office with the authority and guidance for how to weigh in on the issue. Typically these issues have a large impact to the county in multiple areas or groups such as Homeland Security or things that support County-wide initiatives like Live Well.
