Public Health Services (PHS) (Dr. Dean Sidelinger)	 Flu: influenza detections were elevated last week with presentations of influenza-like illness to the ED's being at expected levels; there have been 61 deaths this season Hepatitis A: health alert to go out to providers on an increased number of cases (16 since 11/2016) with a recent cluster of cases with onset in 02/2017; 7 cases have occurred in homeless individuals Zika: 85 cases in San Diego as of 3/3 (all travel associated) with 3 cases in pregnant women Bicillin: health alert to go out to providers on national shortage of bicillin, with local impacts; alert will have advice on syphilis treatment CCS: Rady's ACO pilot – no new update: enrollment not expected before 07/2018
