Live Well San Diego is an ambitious, long-term plan that involves everyone – not just County government – working together to promote healthy, safe and thriving communities.

How progress will be measured: The *Live Well San Diego* Indicators are part of a framework that spans across 5 Areas of Influence: Health, Knowledge, Standard of Living, Community and Social, which influence well-being across the life span of an individual. The *Live Well San Diego* Indicators, introduced in October 2013, allow the County to connect a wide array of programs and activities to measurable improvements in the health, safety and well-being of every resident.



What we will learn: We will compare current year data to baseline data, revealing if we are moving in the right direction or if more efforts are needed to change course to a positive direction. We will also review San Diego’s data compared to the state and nation to evaluate how we are doing compared to other jurisdictions.

Current Year Compared To Baseline:

- Four leading Indicators moved in the right direction – **Life Expectancy, Education, Spending Less Than 1/3 of Income on Housing, and Community Involvement.**
- Four leading Indicators moved in the wrong direction – **Quality of Life, Unemployment Rate*, Security, and Vulnerable Populations.**
- Two leading Indicators show no change because current year data was not available – **Physical Environment and Built Environment.**

San Diego County Compared to the State and Nation:

- We are doing better than both the state and nation on four of our Leading Indicators—**Life Expectancy, Quality of Life, Security**, and Community Involvement.**
- We are doing better than the state for four leading Indicators – **Education, Unemployment, Physical Environment, and Vulnerable Populations.**
- We are doing better than the nation for one leading Indicator – **Built Environment.**
- We are doing worse than both the state and nation for one leading Indicator – **Income.**



Next Steps:

- Evaluate progress; strategize to improve outcomes.
- Communicate progress with partners and the community.
- Implement actions to achieve results and move the dial on the Indicators in the right direction.
