The Planning Process

The County of San Diego Department of Parks and Recreation is developing a Resource Management Plan and a Public Access Plan for the 3,490-acre Ramona Grasslands Preserve. This involves compiling information on the Preserve's existing resources, proposing ways to sustain those resources over time, and identifying opportunities for the public to access and enjoy this open space.

Objectives for Public Access

- Promote passive recreation and enjoyment in the Preserve
- Protect the Preserve's sensitive environmental resources
- Respect nearby property owners
- Provide universally accessible trail use opportunities
- Accommodate a variety of trail uses
- Educate visitors about the Preserve's history and resources

Where we are now and next steps...

- We have conducted baseline inventories of the Preserve's biological and cultural resources.
- We are synthesizing existing data to develop opportunities and constraints regarding public access (see preliminary Opportunities and Constraints map on the reverse side).
- Today's public workshop helps us understand your desired experiences and destinations, and will help guide Public Access Plan development.
- We will summarize the findings from this workshop and share them with the public.
- Alternatives for public access will be developed, and a preferred alternative plan will be refined.



