Purpose (specify in detail privilege requested, or units of products involved)

The County of San Diego and/or its designee (consultants) will access across the SDNWR Village 15 Parcel (APNs 647-030-08 & 647-050-05) using existing dirt roads as it passes through the parcels for the purpose of implementing management and monitoring of the biological resources on Otay Ranch Preserve parcels located in the vicinity of SDNWR parcels. More specifically, the roads will be used to complete biological surveys, enhancement/restoration projects (as needed), maintenance and monitoring, and basic stewardship on Otay Ranchy Preserve Owner/Manager (POM) managed lands.

Description (specify unit numbers: metes and bounds, or other recognizable designations)

County and/or its designee will be using vehicles with 4-wheel drive capabilities. These vehicles are likely to be marked with logos indicating their affiliation. The access roads may be used approximately two to three times per week. It should be noted that the use of the access roads on the parcels referenced above may increase for short periods of time when biological resource surveys are being conducted and/or enhancement/restoration projects are in progress.

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Reports Received

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- 1) Permittee(s) must carry a copy of this permit with them while on the Refuge, and present this permit to Refuge personnel on request.
- 2) Permittee must notify the Refuge (619-468-9245 x226 or 619-719-8579) in advance of entering the Refuge. Notification can be by email to Jill_Terp@fws.gov providing a monthly schedule of visits.
- 3) Permittee is responsible for stressing the sensitive nature of habitats and species found on the Refuge to its personnel and/or designees. Impacts to all biological, natural, and cultural resources of the Refuge are to be avoided.
- 4) Any damage to Refuge property or resources, or harm to any threatened or endangered species, must be reported to the Refuge office immediately.
- 5) Permittees will restrict vehicular travel to existing main road. Driving off-road is not permitted.
- 6) Permittee understands that they are responsible for the security of gates at the entry point. Yellow gate at Otay Lakes Road entry point must be never be left unlocked or standing open.
