Dear Mr. Bradley,

Per your request, SWCA Environmental Consultants (SWCA) has prepared this addendum to the following referenced report that we prepared in support of the Stonemark Estates Project (Project), located in unincorporated San Diego County, California:

*SWCA (2008) Archaeological Survey, Testing, and Evaluation of Three Bedrock Milling Feature Sites, and Evaluation of One Built-Environment Resource for the Stonemark Estates Project in Unincorporated San Diego County, California. Report on File at the County of San Diego Planning and Development Services.*

The original Project design has been modified since the submission of this report to the County of San Diego Planning and Development Services (County). This letter discusses changes to the Project, how these changes affect or impact the known cultural resources on the Project area, and our recommendations for mitigating those impacts.

The updated Project design has been evaluated and it has been determined that one archaeological resource that was previously situated within open space easement on the original Project design, site CA-SDI-18743, will be destroyed by Project development under the updated design. Site CA-SDI-18743 is a bedrock milling feature that was evaluated for significance by SWCA in 2008. This evaluation consisted of surface recordation, subsurface investigation, and exhaustive recording of the bedrock milling feature. The site was found to be a significant resource under Criterion 4 of the California Register of Historical Resources (CRHR) and the Local Register. The results of SWCA's (2008) evaluation further indicated that the site is not a significant cultural resource under the County's Resource Protection Ordinance (RPO). Through this evaluation, SWCA further determined that the site lacks a subsurface component. Due to

the lack of a subsurface component, combined with the exhaustive recording of the bedrock milling feature that had been done, this site is not likely to yield additional information important to the further understanding of the prehistory of San Diego County beyond what was already documented. Thus, the surface recordation, subsurface testing program, and site interpretation have captured all available information from the site, and have exhausted its research potential, thereby lessening the level of Project impacts to it to a level of less than significant under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (SWCA 2008).

Site CA-SDI-18743 was evaluated as significant; however, impacts have been mitigated to a level below significant by SWCA's (2008) previous recording, testing, and interpreting the site. Therefore, any impacts to this site incurred through the updated Project design would not be significant under CEQA or the County's RPO.
