H-1

The purpose of the Tiered Equine Ordinance is to develop a tiered system of permitting for the commercial Horse Stable use type. The private use of horses, which is considered Horsekeeping does not and will not have the same rules and regulations as a business the commercial horse stable. The commercial Horse Stable use type is considered a business and therefore has additional requirements under the ordinance that are typically applied to businesses, such as a public parking area and sign limits, etc. Horsekeeping is required to comply with existing requirements and limitations, which all horse operations must comply with, including but not limited to, the grading, stormwater management and watershed protection ordinances.

The Tiered Equine Ordinance mainly applies to the commercial Horse Stable use type (businesses) see response in H-1. There are minor updates in the draft ordinance for the Horsekeeping use type, existing regulations continue to apply, see response in H-1.

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
