Thank You. However, the section that you sent is the part void of mentioning the chemical components in the miles of solar panels planned. There is no reference to material safety data sheets (MSDS), safety data sheets (SDS),[or product safety data sheets (PSDS) regarding whether these substances are safe in high concentrations, especially in the likely event of fire. There is no information such as the melting point, boiling point, flash point, toxicity, health effects, first aid, reactivity, storage, disposal, protective equipment, and spill-

handling procedures. There is a duty to properly identify these substances and their risk factors related to health and/or environmental risk. Hopefully the county would not allow huge industrial projects in residential areas without knowing the chemical components of the proposed large scale structures involved.

The report that you sent is intentionally long winded. The report and the projects are intended to overburden the residents. A thousand page report, or whatever it is, I stopped reading after a few hundred pages, doesn't convince me that these projects are not completely out of place, due to aesthetics, fire, water and material hazards, At least they admit in the report that the Tierra Del Sol project is totally aesthetically out of place and with no way to rectify that. Obviously you cannot put miles of industry in the country and make it look right. You don't need a thousand page report to analyze this. It should be a non starter from there. Also, please advise where in the report is the list of hazardous materials that would be in the solar panels, especially materials that are toxic in the event of fire, given the high fire prone planned location of these projects? This seems to be a serious shortcoming in the report, wherein it is admitted that eventual fires are likely in the area of the projects .
