Crystal Benham, PDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• What is your knowledge of the MSCP so far?</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Very familiar with the process as the City of San Diego was a part of the South County MSCP process.</li><li>• Currently working on incorporating climate change considerations into Resource Management Plans</li><li>• Kim Roeland will send Crystal Benham an example of incorporating climate change.</li></ul>
Kim Roeland, City of San Diego	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The City of San Diego's MSCP cover 85 species</li><li>• What caused the decrease from 63 to 29 Covered Species List in the North County Plan?</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Because of new USFWS requirements for species-level monitoring for any listed species, the cost to monitor at the species level is cost prohibitive.</li><li>• The Plan now includes Watch List Species (14 species) which may become listed in 50 years.</li><li>• The other species are not prevalent in the plan area and/or are protected by other regulations.</li></ul>
