	What does take authorization mean?	<ul> <li>Regarding threatened and endangered species. The County issues a permit to developers to "take" the species (impact its habitat) provided that certain mitigation requirements are met.</li> </ul>
Center for Conservation Strategies	Fallbrook's suggestions	<ul> <li>For acquisition efforts, maps and APNs for patches of concern can help get federal funding if patches are in PAMA.</li> </ul>
		Camp Pendleton is a major partner.
	What changes have been made to the North County MSCP since 2009?	<ul> <li>Pre-Approved Mitigation Area (PAMA) has shrunk slightly since the previous version of the North County Plan because of areas that got developed and it accounts for agricultural expansions.</li> </ul>
Scott Molloy, Newland Real Estate Group	There is concern that a plan with fewer covered species will have less value to developers in the community.	<ul> <li>The County is confident with the current Covered Species list and Watch list.</li> <li>Because of new USFWS requirements for species-level monitoring for any listed species, the cost to monitor at the species level is cost prohibitive.</li> <li>The Plan now includes Watch List Species (14 species) which may become listed in 50 years. The other species are not prevalent in the plan area and/or are protected by other regulations.</li> <li>Covered is for species listed as threatened or endangered. If it is not listed, no take authorization is required.</li> <li>There is difference between covered species receiving take authorization and how the plan can aid development projects conducting CEQA analysis.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>How much of the existing Preserve lands are we getting credit for?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Will get credit for lands we've conserved to date. These lands are the "baseline preserve."</li> <li>If lands are outside of PAMA, will not receive credit.</li> </ul>
	Will mitigation banks and associated RMPs change?	If it is already approved, nothing will change.
	What activities are covered?	<ul> <li>Trail construction is a covered activity within the North County Preserve.</li> </ul>
	What does covered activity mean?	<ul> <li>It's a list of activities anticipated and accounted for within the plan.</li> <li>The Framework Resource Management Plan (FRMP) will serve as an umbrella guide for individual Resource Management Plans (RMP).</li> </ul>
	Are there adjacent agricultural lands that could be made into natural habitat?	<ul> <li>Generally no PAMA, but may have connectivity value so some are in PAMA. The PAMA determination looks at underlying habitat.</li> </ul>
	What are the details of uptiering and downtiering?	<ul> <li>Will be included in the Biological Mitigation Ordinance (BMO) for the North County MSCP. It is currently in draft form, starting with the South County Plan's BMO.</li> </ul>
