


LILAC HILLS RANCH OFF-SITE IMPROVEMENTS – MILLER FIRE STATION CULTURAL RESOURCES

The Lilac Hills Ranch project includes potential improvements to the existing Miller Fire Station located at 9127 W. Lilac Road, adjacent to the project site. This report serves as an addendum to the cultural resources report for the project: *Cultural Resources Inventory and Assessment: Lilac Hills Ranch, Escondido, San Diego County, California* by Mary Robbins-Wade and Andrew Giletti of Affinis.

The fire station property was covered by the records searches conducted for the project (Confidential Appendix A of the cultural resources technical report). No archaeological sites have been recorded within the fire station property. The Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) was contacted for a search of their Sacred Lands Files in conjunction with the cultural resources study for the project. The NAHC indicated that no Native American cultural resources were identified within ½ mile of the project (see Confidential Appendix D of the cultural resources technical report).

The fire station property was surveyed for cultural resources on May 2, 2013 by Andrew Giletti of Affinis and P.J. Stoneburner of Savings Sacred Sites (Native American Monitor). They were joined on-site by Cheyenne Dorello, CalFire archaeologist. The property was walked in parallel transects spaced approximately 10 m apart. Ground visibility was fair in those areas not covered by hardscape or maintained grass. No evidence of archaeological resources was found during the field survey. Therefore, no impacts to cultural resources are anticipated from potential improvements to the fire station. However, given the cultural sensitivity of the area, it is recommended that any ground-disturbing activity be monitored by a qualified archaeologist and a Native American monitor.
