# CCP Funding Proposals

A.	<p><b>Evaluation Period Extension (SANDAG)</b></p> <p>Starting January 2013, SANDAG initiated an evaluation which was designed to compare realigned individuals through a thorough examination and tracking/comparison of the PRCS, 1170(h)(5)(A), 1170(h)(5)(B), and custodial alternative populations. The contract for the evaluation was initially signed for \$400,000 for a two year period (January 2013 through December 2014). Because those sentenced to Penal Code § 1170(h) cannot be tracked until their time in custody is served, the longer the evaluation period is, the more valid and reliable the samples will be. This proposal funds the addition of three years at \$200,000 per year, extending the evaluation period to December 2017. This proposal supports San Diego Realignment Goal #3, "Incorporate Evidence-Based Practices into Supervision and Case Management."</p>	\$200,000	0.0
B.	<p><b>Regional Realignment Response Group (Sheriff)</b></p> <p>The mission of the Regional Realignment Response Group is to have the criminal justice system partners' work collaboratively to leverage their law enforcement resources to conduct unified and integrated proactive targeted crime prevention and crime suppression efforts within San Diego County to disrupt, dismantle and ultimately prevent crimes. San Diego County Sheriff's Department requests funding of \$800,000 to be used in Fiscal Year 2014-15 by participating law enforcement agencies for overtime to monitor and address high-risk targets identified by the Criminal Intelligence Analysts. This proposal supports San Diego Realignment Goal #3, "Incorporate Evidence-Based Practices into Supervision and Case Management."</p>	\$800,000	0.0
