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# SB678 Update

- **Evidence Based Practices Supervision Program (EBPSP)**
  - Treatment services provided to High Risk population
  - Covers all county regions
  - For Fiscal Year 2011/2012, the Probation Department has completed 937 referrals

# SB678 Update

- **Integrated Behavioral Intervention Strategies (IBIS)**
  - 90 senior probation staff have been trained to mentor 360 line staff
  - 90% of Adult Field Service Officers have been trained in the IBIS model
  - Over 50% of department employees are trained in the application of IBIS skills

# SB678 Plan Update

- **Incentives and Sanctions (I&S) Continuum**
  - I&S Continuum is an evidence based practice
  - Incorporate I&S Continuum into probationers' case plan development
  - I&S Continuum will allow swift and certain sanctions
  - Behavior change and reduce recidivism


# EBPSP Treatment Services

- Behavioral Health Treatment Services
- People Served in Fiscal Year 2011/12:
  - 572 admissions to substance abuse treatment
  - Tend to be white males, between ages of 25-59 with marijuana, meth or alcohol as their drug of choice
  - 15% completion rate

# Defining the Problem

- Currently, 15% or 345 Post-Release Offenders (approx. 2,300) reporting transient
- Public Safety Issue
  - Studies suggest homelessness increases the risk of recidivism
  - Expose the community to criminal behavior
  - Reduce likelihood of offender successfully reentering the community
- Fiscal Issue
  - Early intervention is more cost effective



# Lack of Housing Also Results In....

- Increased costs to criminal justice system, victims and community
- Offenders returning to same set of conditions and criminal opportunities that got them into trouble in the first place
- Concentration of offenders in certain neighborhoods or areas
- Difficulty securing employment
