



STATE OES APPARATUS:





- The County added a third fire rescue helicopter
- For the first time ever, the entire region now has night-flying fire helicopter capability as a result of a contract with the City of San Diego
- \$250,000 set aside by County to boost air resources during the initial stage of a major fire

- Fire agencies equipped with thermal-imaging devices to track and map fast-moving blazes
- New firefighting vehicles deployed, including: 9 new wildland patrol engines; 3 new water tenders for structure defense; 1 new wildland engine; 1 new GIS trailer
- New County Fire station opened in Boulevard
- All career-staffed County fire stations will have paramedics by July 1
- Boosted the ranks of County Fire Authority active reserves to more than 300 from 210



- Launched the "Ready, Set, Go" wildfire preparedness campaign
- Updated the region's "Red Guide to Recovery," a comprehensive handbook for disaster survivors
- Worked with community groups to ensure that more non-English speaking residents receive alerts in an emergency
