

*Salvia coccinea* 'Hummingbird White'

An annual salvia, which lives over as a perennial in San Diego. Grows 2'-3' tall with white flowers spring, summer, and fall. Easy care plant. Self sows. Best in full sun, but will grow in bright part shade. Seed heads are a favorite of goldfinches.

*Elaeagnus philippinensis* Lingaro Berry

An evergreen shrub or small tree to about ten feet with a great arching habit with silvery leaves. Edible shimmering red berries in the fall are small and tart. Excellent fresh, in a sauce or desert. Full sun, easy to grow, drought tolerant, a big bird draw. A great source of lycopine. Birds love the berries too.

*Heteromeles arbutifolia* Toyon

Evergreen small tree from California with dark green leaves and a serrated edge. Arching branches carry fall clusters of bright red berries that take center stage. Full sun or part, very drought tolerant. Early on this plant was misidentified as a Holly, which gave Hollywood its name. Birds attracted to berries.
