Please consider the comments below.

1. Recreation should be considered as a potential impact since almost 1,500 acres will no longer be available for recreational hunting - regardless of the fact these were private properties, the introduction of large scale solar panels will limit directional shooting and therefore does present an impact to hunting. Another impact of that hunting is the migratory, foraging, and breeding grounds of those hunted animals will no longer be available to them.
2. Each individual MUP should have their own EIR - not a programmatic EIR that can be used for any future development that this or other companies will likely use.
3. None of these projects are consistent with the BOS approved General Plan or with the Boulevard Community Plan.
4. These projects have not established a real need - SDGE is currently on schedule to meet their energy renewable quota without any of these projects.
