Description: Research methods included a records search of County maps, reports and documents and a field survey. The record search determined that there were no previous surveys within the project area itself, although, the record search did show that other archaeology surveys were conducted for the Sky Ranch project directly to the north of the Hiel property, Those surveys identified several prehistoric sites with one site, CA-SDI-16968, located near the southern border of the Sky Ranch project area,

close to the Hiel's northern boundary. The purpose of the field survey was to try to relocate CA-SDI-16968 and to determine if it extended into the Hiel property. The site could not be relocated, possibly because of the heavy ground cover. The property is near the base of steep hill and most of the undeveloped parcel is on steep sloped land. The western half of the parcel is developed and most of the eastern portion of the parcel had a heavy ground cover of mostly native grasses resulting in poor ground visibility. However, open areas, rodent activity, as well as several trails provided an adequate sampling of the soil and subsurface deposits. No cultural resources, prehistoric or historic, were identified during the field survey. This project proposes to subdivide a 0.71-acre parcel into two residential lots; a single-family residence already exists on the western half of the parcel. Given the negative results, no further work is required.
