Other Locational Data: The project is located in the community of Valley Center. Take Interstate 15 to Gopher Canyon Road exit. Turn right at Gopher Canyon Road and then left on Old highway 395. Turn right on Circle R Drive and then turn right on West Lilac Road. Turn right on Diaz Road and then right onto King Sanday Lane.

Description: The field survey was conducted using standard archaeological procedures and techniques. For the most part, continuous parallel transects (10 meters) were walked in an east/west direction. Survey conditions were good, with some areas partially obscured by thick vegetation and citrus trees. No artifacts or features were identified during this survey. The

proposed project is a residential Tentative Parcel Map. The project proposes to divide 5.05 net acres into two equal parcels.

Prior Research: Staff conducted a records search of the surrounding area using the California Historic Resources Inventory System (CHRIS). Twelve studies have been conducted within a one-mile radius and three previously recorded sites were identified.

Native American Consultation: A Sacred Lands check was initiated on December 14, 2007 to the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC). Staff contacted the Native American groups and individuals provided by the NAHC on December 26, 2007 to further investigate whether they have knowledge of Sacred Lands occurring on the subject parcels.
