The proposed project and any off-site improvements related to the proposed project are within the boundaries of the Multiple Species Conservation Program. Discussion:

As identified within Section 67.722.A (Residential Density Controls) of the San Diego County Groundwater Ordinance, all parcels for single-family dwellings must be a

minimum of **5** gross acres. The project's smallest lot is **8.6** gross acres, which is in compliance with the Groundwater Ordinance Residential Density Controls.

As identified within Section 67.722.C (Well Tests) of the San Diego County Groundwater Ordinance, the project conducted one required residential well test which passed the residential well test requirements as defined in Section 67.703 of the Groundwater Ordinance.

Discussion:

***Wetland and Wetland Buffers:***

The site contains no wetland habitats as defined by the San Diego County Resource Protection Ordinance. Although there is an ephemeral drainage on-site, the site does not have a substratum of predominately undrained hydric soils, the land does not support, even periodically, hydric plants, nor does the site have a substratum that is non-soil and is saturated with water or covered by water at some time during the growing season of each year. Therefore, it has been found that the proposed project complies with Sections 86.604(a) and (b) of the Resource Protection Ordinance.

***Floodways and Floodplain Fringe:***

The project is not located near any floodway/floodplain fringe area as defined in the resource protection ordinance, nor is it located near any watercourse which is plotted on any official County floodway/floodplain map.

***Steep Slopes:***

Slopes with a gradient of 25 percent or greater and 50 feet or higher in vertical height are required to be placed in open space easements by the San Diego County Resource Protection Ordinance (RPO). There are steep slopes on the property however, an open

space easement is proposed over the entire steep slope lands. Therefore, the project is in conformance with the RPO.

***Sensitive Habitats:***

No sensitive habitat lands were identified on the site as determined by a review of aerial photographs, GIS, a Biological Resource Letter Report (Robin Church, June 13, 2008), and a site visit conducted by Mark Slovick on July 29, 2008. Therefore, it has been found that the proposed project complies with Section 86.604(f) of the RPO.

***Significant Prehistoric and Historic Sites:***

The property has been surveyed by a County of San Diego certified archaeologist/historian Andrew Pignuolo of Laguna Mountain Environmental and it has been determined there is one archaeological resource located on the property. The resource, P-37-027199, is an isolated volcanic angular waste fragment. It is not eligible under RPO and is not considered a significant resource. It does not need to be preserved under the Resource Protection Ordinance. The project must comply with the San Diego County Grading, Clearing, and Watercourse Ordinance (§87.101-87.804), CEQA §15064.5(d), and §7050.5 of the Health & Safety Code. Section 87.429 of the Grading, Clearance, and Watercourse Ordinance requires the suspension of grading operations when human remains or Native American artifacts are encountered.

Discussion:

DPW staff has reviewed the Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP), Preliminary Drainage Study, and Preliminary Grading Plan prepared by Walsh Engineering & Surveying. Previous comments have been addressed. The document is substantially complete and complies with the San Diego County Standard Urban Stormwater Mitigation Plan (SUSMP) and Watershed Protection Ordinance (WPO) requirements for a SWMP.

**VI. NOISE ORDINANCE** – Does the project comply with the County of San Diego Noise Element of the General Plan and the County of San Diego Noise Ordinance?

Discussion:

The proposal would not expose people to nor generate potentially significant noise levels which exceed the allowable limits of the County of San Diego Noise Element of the General Plan, County of San Diego Noise Ordinance, and other applicable local, State, and Federal noise control regulations.

Transportation (traffic, railroad, aircraft) noise levels at the project site are not expected to exceed Community Noise Equivalent Level (CNEL)=60 decibels (dB) limit because review of the project indicates that the project is not in close proximity to a railroad and/or airport. Additionally, the County of San Diego GIS noise model does not indicate that the project would be subject to potential excessive noise levels from circulation element roads either now or at General Plan buildout.

Noise impacts to the proposed project from adjacent land uses are not expected to exceed the property line sound level limits of the County of San Diego Noise Ordinance.
