Wetland and Wetland Buffers: The site contains no wetland habitats as defined by the San Diego County Resource Protection Ordinance. The site does not have a substratum of predominately undrained hydric soils, the land does not support, even periodically, hydric plants, nor does the site have a substratum that is non-soil and is saturated with water or covered by water at some time during the growing season of each year.

Floodways and Floodplain: The project is not located near any floodway or floodplain fringe area as defined in the Resource Protection Ordinance, nor is it near a watercourse plotted on any official County floodway or floodplain map.

Steep Slopes: The average slope for the project site is less than 10 percent gradient. Slopes with a gradient of 25 percent or greater and 50 feet or higher in vertical height are required to be placed in open space easements by the San Diego County Resource Protection Ordinance (RPO). There are no steep slopes on the property. The project is in conformance with the RPO.

Sensitive Habitats: Sensitive habitat lands include unique vegetation communities and/or habitat that is either necessary to support a viable population of sensitive species, is critical to the proper functioning of a balanced natural ecosystem, or which serves as a functioning wildlife corridor. No sensitive habitat lands were identified on the site as determined on a site visit conducted by County of San Diego, Department of Planning and Land Use biologist on July 10, 2008. Therefore, it has been found that the proposed project complies with Section 86.604(f) of the Resource Protection Ordinance.

Significant Prehistoric and Historic Sites: The property has been surveyed by a County of San Diego approved archaeologist, James Clifford on February 2, 2007, and it has been determined that there is one archaeological resource nearby: CA-SDI-570C as well as eight resources within ½ mile. CA-SDI-570 known as the Felicita County Park Prehistoric Village Site and has been determined by the Office of Historic Preservation (OHP) as eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion D. A portion of the Village Site, CA-SDI-570C is a bedrock milling feature located near the proposed wireless facility. An archaeological technical study titled, "*Revised Archaeological Survey and Limited Presence/Absence Subsurface Testing of the*

Proposed Felicita Park Cellular Site, SAN-222-A, 742 Clarence Lane, Escondido, San Diego County, California", dated July 17, 2007, prepared by James Clifford of SWCA Environmental Consultants. The report evaluated the significance of the archaeological resource CA-SDI-570C based on a surface survey around the site and subsurface testing, it has been determined that the archaeological resource is not significant pursuant to the State of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Section 15064.5. No artifacts were found either on the surface or subsurface. Testing and other investigation determined the archaeological/historical site does not meet the definition of significant site. It does not need to be preserved under the Resource Protection Ordinance.
