While the proposed project and off-site improvements are located outside of the boundaries of the Multiple Species Conservation Program, the mining operation was established prior to adoption of the Habitat Loss Permit Ordinance and has a vested right to conduct extraction activities over the entire site. Therefore, this action does not require a Major Use Permit. Reclamation of the site once mining activities have ceased will not result in any new impacts to habitats subject to the Habitat Loss Permit/Coastal Sage Scrub Ordinance. In addition, no grading plan, improvement plan, or clearing permit is required in conjunction with the Reclamation Plan. Thus a Habitat Loss Permit is not required (Section 86.102).
