1. **Presentation by County Entomologists on Proposed Changes to Beekeeping Ordinance:** Current ordinance requires an apiary to be 100 feet from a road and 600 feet from a dwelling. The changes include reducing the minimum distance required between managed bee hives and structures while maintaining a safe distance for people and animals, as well as sensitive sites like hospitals and day care centers. **Discussion / Action Item**
2. **Prioritization Request for Roadway Pavement Maintenance and Capital Improvement Projects in the Twin Oaks Valley Community (CSG Area):** The County needs the community's assistance in identifying roads that need maintenance improvements. The County would like us to identify our top 20 road segments that need immediate attention. Bring or email photos if you have them of especially degraded roads in our community. **Discussion / Action Item**

1. **Cell Tower Legislation by San Marcos:** Cell tower installations have caused concerns within the community. Aiming to limit so-called "cell tower farms" in San Marcos, city officials say they're exploring new legislation that could give telecommunications companies incentives to use groups of smaller, less

conspicuous antennas instead of large towers. San Marcos would be the first city in San Diego County to have a cell tower ordinance that embraces a relatively new technology called a “distributed antenna system.” In such a system, a group of smaller antennas transmits the same data as one large antenna would. Ventura County adopted an ordinance last fall that makes the approval process for cell antennas faster and cheaper if companies propose the smaller antennas, which are typically less than 4 feet tall.<http://www.utsandiego.com/news/2014/mar/09/san-marcos-cell-tower-new-technology/> **Discussion / Action Item**
