H1N1 VACCINE ARRIVES IN SAN DIEGO COUNTY *Media Availability Today at 11 a.m.*

WHAT: The first allotment of H1N1 vaccine arrived late yesterday in San Diego County. 26,000 doses of H1N1 nasal spray vaccine will be available at various primary care physicians' offices throughout the county.

An additional 2,000 doses are offered at County public health centers. Additional supplies of H1N1 vaccine are expected to arrive in the coming weeks.

Today, reporters and photographers are welcome to shoot video and photos of the H1N1 nasal spray vaccine.

INFO: According to state guidelines, the initial doses of the H1N1 nasal spray vaccine are designated for children 2-18 years of age who are healthy and healthy household contacts of infants younger than 6 months.
