

**HOAC Priority Bill Tracking Report
High Priority HOAC Bills
October 15, 2013
Final Report for 2013**

1 - Sponsored Bills

[AB 272](#) (Gomez D) Rabies: vaccinations.

Last Amend: 8/20/2013

Status: 10/5/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 582, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 10/5/2013-A. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would require that a dog owner, after his or her dog is 3 months of age or older, procure the dog's vaccination against rabies by a licensed veterinarian with canine antirabies vaccine approved by the State Department of Public Health and in a manner consistent with the vaccine label. By expanding the definition of a crime, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

[AB 8](#) (Perea D) Alternative fuel and vehicle technologies: funding programs.

Last Amend: 9/6/2013

Status: 9/28/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 401, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 9/28/2013-A. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would provide that the State Air Resources Board has no authority to enforce any element of its existing clean fuels outlet regulation or other regulation that requires or has the effect of requiring any supplier, as defined, to construct, operate, or provide funding for the construction or operation of any publicly available hydrogen-fueling station. The bill would require the state board to aggregate and make available to the public, no later than June 30, 2014, and every year thereafter, the number of hydrogen-fueled vehicles that motor vehicle manufacturers project to be sold or leased over the next 3 years, as reported to the state board, and the number of hydrogen-fueled vehicles registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles through April 30. The bill would require the commission to allocate \$20 million annually, as specified, until there are at least 100 publicly available hydrogen-fueling stations in California. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

[AB 411](#) (Pan D) Medi-Cal: performance measures.

Last Amend: 9/11/2013

Status: 10/8/2013-Vetoed by the Governor

Location: 10/8/2013-A. VETOED

Summary: Would require, when the State Department of Health Care Services enters

into a new contract with an EQRO for the EQRO to perform work associated with Medi-Cal managed care programs, that the department include in the terms of the new contract a requirement that, upon approval of the contract, the EQRO stratify all patient-specific Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set measures, or their External Accountability Set performance measure equivalent, by certain characteristics, including geographic area and primary language.

AB 506 (Mitchell D) HIV testing: infants.

Last Amend: 7/2/2013

Status: 8/26/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 153, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 8/26/2013-A. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would authorize a social worker to provide consent for an HIV test to be performed on an infant who is less than 12 months of age when the infant has been taken into temporary custody or has been, or has a petition filed with the court to be, adjudged a dependent child of the court and the infant is receiving medical care if, among other things, the attending physician and surgeon determines that HIV testing is necessary to render appropriate care to the infant. This bill contains other existing laws.

AB 999 (Bonta D) Prisoner Protections for Family and Community Health Act.

Last Amend: 9/3/2013

Status: 10/12/2013-Vetoed by the Governor

Location: 10/12/2013-A. VETOED

Summary: Would require the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to develop a 5-year plan to extend the availability of condoms in all California prisons. The bill would require, commencing January 1, 2015, and contingent upon the receipt of donations by the department, that no less than 5 prisons be incorporated into the program each year, and would require a comprehensive plan to include every prison in the state by the final year. The bill would require all nonadministrative costs of the program, including the dispensers and condoms, to be paid for through donations. The bill would make related findings and declarations.

SB 191 (Padilla D) Emergency medical services.

Last Amend: 8/22/2013

Status: 10/5/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 600, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 10/5/2013-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Current law, until January 1, 2014, authorizes county boards of supervisors to elect to levy an additional penalty, for deposit into the EMS Fund, in the amount of \$2 for every \$10 upon fines, penalties, and forfeitures collected for criminal offenses. Current law, until January 1, 2014, requires 15% of the funds collected pursuant to that provision be used to provide funding for pediatric trauma centers. This bill would extend the operative date of these provisions until January 1, 2017. The bill would also make a technical, nonsubstantive change to these provisions.

SB 249 (Leno D) Public health: health records: confidentiality.

Last Amend: 9/3/2013

Status: 10/1/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 445, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 10/1/2013-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Current law requires health care providers and laboratories to report cases of HIV infection to the local health officer using patient names on a form developed by the State Department of Public Health. This bill would authorize both the local health officer and the department to access reports of HIV infection that are electronically submitted by laboratories pursuant to the above-described provision. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

SB 294 (Emmerson R) Sterile drug products.

Last Amend: 9/3/2013

Status: 10/4/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter No. 565, Statutes of 2013

Location: 10/4/2013-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would require the California State Board of Pharmacy to adopt regulations to implement specified provisions, and, on and after July 1, 2014, to review formal revisions to specified national standards relating to the compounding of sterile preparations to determine whether amendments to those regulations are necessary, as specified. By adding additional requirements to the Pharmacy Law concerning sterile drug products, the violation of which is a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

	Last Amend: 9/6/2013
	Status: 10/8/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 658, Statutes of 2013.
	Location: 10/8/2013-S. CHAPTERED
	Summary: Would include in the definition of public social services publicly funded health care services administered or supervised by the department or the State Department of Health Care Services, except as specified. The bill would state that this provision clarifies existing law.

<u>SB 402</u>	(De León D) Breastfeeding.
	Last Amend: 6/18/2013
	Status: 10/9/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 666, Statutes of 2013.
	Location: 10/9/2013-S. CHAPTERED
	Summary: Would require all general acute care hospitals and special hospitals that have a perinatal unit to adopt, by January 1, 2025, the "Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding," as adopted by Baby-Friendly USA, per the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative, or an alternate process adopted by a health care service plan that includes evidenced-based policies and practices and targeted outcomes, or the Model Hospital Policy Recommendations as defined.

SB 809 (DeSaulnier D) Controlled substances: reporting.

Last Amend: 9/3/2013

Status: 9/27/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 400, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 9/27/2013-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would establish the CURES Fund within the State Treasury to receive funds to be allocated, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to the Department of Justice for the purposes of funding CURES, and would make related findings and declarations. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

[AB 446](#) (Mitchell D) HIV testing.

Last Amend: 9/6/2013

Status: 10/5/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 589, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 10/5/2013-A. CHAPTERED

Summary: Current law, with specified exceptions, requires a written statement documenting the test subject's informed consent prior to the performance of an HIV test. This bill would require that the medical care provider or the person who administers the test also provide a patient with specified information after the test results are received. The bill would require informed consent, as specified, either orally or in writing, except when a person independently requests an HIV test from an HIV counseling and testing site, as specified. The bill would require the person administering a test for a provider covered by the exemption to document the person's independent request for the test. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

7 - Tracked Bills

[AB 127](#) (Skinner D) Fire safety: fire retardants: building insulation.

Last Amend: 9/3/2013

Status: 10/5/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 579, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 10/5/2013-A. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would require the State Fire Marshal, in consultation with the Bureau of Electronic and Appliance Repair, Home Furnishings, and Thermal Insulation, to review the flammability standards for building insulation materials, including whether the flammability standards for some insulation materials can only be met with the addition of chemical flame retardants. The bill would require, if deemed appropriate by the State Fire Marshal based on this review, the State Fire Marshal to, by July 1, 2015, propose for consideration by the commission updated insulation flammability standards that accomplish certain things, including maintaining overall building fire safety.

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[AB 626](#) (Skinner D) School nutrition.

Last Amend: 7/10/2013

Status: 10/10/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 706, Statutes of

2013.

Location: 10/10/2013-A. CHAPTERED

Summary: In selecting grantees to participate in the 21st Century High School After School Safety and Enrichment for Teens program, existing law requires the State Department of Education to consider specified criteria and requires an applicant to certify in the application, among other things, the inclusion of a nutritional snack and a physical activity element. This bill instead would require an applicant to certify in the application, among other things, the inclusion of a nutritional snack, meal, or both, and a physical activity element. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

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AB 635 (Ammiano D) Drug overdose treatment: liability.

Last Amend: 8/22/2013

Status: 10/10/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 707, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 10/10/2013-A. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would revise and recast certain provisions to instead authorize a licensed health care provider who is permitted by law to prescribe an opioid antagonist and is acting with reasonable care to prescribe and subsequently dispense or distribute an opioid antagonist for the treatment of an opioid overdose to a person at risk of an opioid-related overdose or a family member, friend, or other person in a position to assist a person at risk of an opioid-related overdose. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

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AB 1290 (John A. Pérez D) Transportation planning.

Last Amend: 9/3/2013

Status: 10/11/2013-Vetoed by the Governor

Location: 10/11/2013-A. VETOED

Summary: Would provide for 2 additional voting members of the California Transportation Commission to be appointed by the Legislature. The bill would also provide for the Chairperson of the State Air Resources Board to serve as an ex officio member without vote. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

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SB 28 (Hernandez D) California Health Benefit Exchange.

Last Amend: 9/6/2013

Status: 10/1/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 442, Statutes of 2013.

Location: 10/1/2013-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would require MRMIB to provide the Exchange, or its designee, with specified information of subscribers and applicants of MRMIP in order to assist the Exchange in conducting outreach to those subscribers and applicants. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.
