General Qualifications for County Student Workers

Applicants must be *full time students* at an accredited college or university. Once employed, student workers must continue to be full time students and maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average (GPA). At the beginning of each new school year (or semester/quarter), student workers/interns are responsible for submitting a “student unit load verification” completed by their academic institution. Note: In addition, student interns shall comply with the established policies and practices of their assigned school’s internship program and the County of San Diego agreement regarding eligibility requirements.
