Kitty Morse was born in Casablanca of a French mother and British father. She attended college in the United States, and obtained her Master's Degree in French at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Kitty's career as a food writer, cooking teacher, and lecturer, spans more than twenty-five years. Her articles appear regularly in *Eating Well*, *Cooking Light*, and *Aramco World*, among others. She has lectured on North African cuisine and culture at *The Smithsonian Institution* in Washington D.C., the *Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs*, and for *The Culinary Historians of Southern California*. One of the highlights of her career was cooking alongside Julia Child at a benefit for the International Association of Culinary Professionals (IACP).
