THE COURAGE TO REMEMBER TRAVELING HOLOCAUST EXHIBIT

January 17 to February 2, 2013

"The Courage to Remember" traveling Holocaust exhibit, produced by the Museum of Tolerance will feature 200 exclusive photographs offering powerful and unique insight into the Holocaust. It is both a tribute and a warning; a tribute to the six million Jews and millions of others, including Gypsies, Slavs, political dissenters, homosexuals, and prisoners of war, who were murdered by the Nazis between 1933 and 1945; and a warning that the root causes of the Holocaust persist. This exhibit will be available and open to the public from January 17- February 2 during library hours. Receptions include live music, informational lectures, and refreshments. Recommended for age 12 and older.

THE COURAGE TO REMEMBER MOVIE MARATHON

Saturday, January 19 starting at 10am

Two feature films relating to World War II and the Holocaust will be featured. The first is an Academy Award winning film chronicling the story of Oskar Schindler, a war profiteer who saves the lives of over 1100 Jews during the Holocaust. Immediately following is the story of the Bielksi brothers, who organize a group of Jewish Partisans against the Nazis in World War II Poland. Both movies are rated R.

Mrs. Gmach is the community outreach coordinator for San Diego State University's Initiative for Moral Courage (IMC). The new interdisciplinary think-tank focuses on the critical study, promotion and recognition of moral courage through a mentoring project that brings together academics, world leaders and students. During Ms. Gmach's 20-year tenure at the Lawrence Family Jewish Community Center (LFJCC) and the San Diego Center for Jewish Culture (SDCJC) she developed the San Diego Jewish Book Fair, the Music Festival and two national exhibits: "Inside Anne Frank's House" and "DAVKA, The Survival of a People." She is involved in numerous community organizations, including American Friends of Magen David Adom and the Agency for Jewish Education, where she served as the 2011 volunteer chair of Yom Limud, a day of Jewish learning that attracts nearly 1,000 people.

YALE STROM

LECTURE & MUSICAL PERFORMANCE

Wednesday, January 30th at 6:30 pm

Violinist, composer, filmmaker, writer, photographer and playwright Yale Strom was a pioneer among revivalists in conducting extensive field research in Central and Eastern Europe and the Balkans among the Jewish and Rom communities since the early 1981. Initially, his work focused primarily on the use and performance of klezmer music among these two groups. Gradually, his focus increased to examining all aspects of their culture, from post-World War II to the present. Over more than 2 decades and 75 such research expeditions, Strom has become one of the world's leading scholar-ethnographer-artists of klezmer music and history.
