The Louis Stelzer County Park Operations project request is to fund partial staff time of a park ranger who is stationed / located at Louis Stelzer County Park, 11470 Wildcat Canyon Road in Lakeside, CA.

2) Evidence showing the relationship between the project and impacts on your jurisdiction associated with the particular casino(s) listed under “D” above, and data linking the percentage of the requested funding to the percentage of impacts associated with particular casinos (include the data source); and

Wildcat Canyon Road traffic data collected from the County of San Diego, Department of Public Works Transportation Division identifies an average daily increase in traffic, between 1991 (3,072 vehicle counts) and 1993 (3,251 vehicle counts) leading from Lakeside at Willow Creek Road and Ashwood north towards the Barona Casino. The percentage of increased traffic per day represents an average of 90 vehicles. When the Barona Casino went into operation in 1994 and expanded in 2003 the traffic increased. Between 1991 (3,072 vehicle counts) and 2002 (5,486 vehicle counts) an annual average increase of vehicles was 2,414 vehicles per day. This equates to a 78.5% increase in traffic.

In line with these traffic increases, day use visitation at Louis Stelzer County Park has increased translating into higher park operations and maintenance costs. Although the percentage traffic increase to park visitation is not a one to one correlation, the increases in maintenance and operations costs are apparent. Park responsibilities are impacted most by the need for increased staff/public interaction, security, stocking, cleaning and maintenance, trash cleanup and general wear and tear on the park's existing features. Just in the last fiscal year visitation increased by 7%.

DPR estimates that 1 park ranger averages approximately 3 hours a week of additional park operation and maintenance work as a result of the impacts of the casino. A park ranger's hourly rate is \$61.52 per hour. Cumulatively speaking, a park ranger's increased maintenance and operating duties of 3 additional hours per week, for 10 years, the increased impact to park and recreation maintenance and operations is estimated to be \$95,971. ($\$61.52/\text{hour} \times 3 \text{ hours/week} \times 52 \text{ weeks} \times 10 \text{ years} = \$95,971$)

This request is for \$9,597 in funding to mitigate the increased park operational and maintenance expenses for one year. ($\$61.52/\text{hour} \times 3 \text{ hours/week} \times 52 \text{ weeks} = \$9,597$.)

The Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund awarded \$9,597 to DPR in Fiscal Year 2011-12 and Fiscal Year 12-13 for the same purpose.

The proposed project mitigates the effect of the resort and casino by funding the increased park operations and maintenance costs associated with the increased traffic and day use visitation as a result of the casino.
