**PRESERVATION OF STANDARD AND SAFE ROADWAY  
MAINTENANCE LEVELS: CCTV TRUCK FOR VIDEO WORK WITHIN  
COUNTY CULVERTS**

**Section F.**

- 1) Project Description: This project grant would purchase a CCTV truck outfitted with state of the art video and camera equipment to document the condition of the interior of the culverts beneath roads that serve the Indian Casinos found within the unincorporated portion of San Diego County. This piece of equipment will assist in the County's efforts to ensure that County roadways offer minimum risks to the public's health and safety and to minimize or prevent storm water pollution.
  
- 2) Relationship between the project and impacts from casino: The County of San Diego utilizes its road equipment fleet to perform full road day-to-day maintenance on its County Maintained Road System of 1800+ centerline miles of paved roadway and 100+ centerline miles of DG roadways. There are approximately 450 centerline miles of paved and DG roads within the two road stations whose boundaries essentially surround and include the primary access routes to both the Sycuan and Barona Nations and associated commercial businesses and residential areas. The use of a CCTV truck allows DPW Road Maintenance to inspect culverts and drainage structures on a regular basis and to document the condition of the underground facilities to ensure these roadways remain stable and reduce the potential for subsurface failures which would impact the roadway and traveling public.

The purchase of such a CCTV truck for the Transportation Division allows the primary use of this vehicle to be focused on roads serving the Indian Casinos, therefore justifying a potential Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund grant for 100% of the cost of this equipment

The major and minor interconnecting County roads providing access to the various Casinos in San Diego County have seen substantial increases in roadway traffic volumes in conjunction with casino operations in the last decade. This increase in traffic corresponds to an increased need for routine maintenance which includes more frequent monitoring of the culverts beneath such roads.

- 3) Mitigation of Impacts: A new CCTV truck with appropriate video and camera equipment will help the County maintain the underground facilities on roadways providing access to San Diego Tribal Casinos. The CCTV truck will allow us to more quickly and efficiently inspect storm drain systems for

maintenance purposes. Improved inspections will ensure limited funding resources are used efficiently, while protecting the environment by removing litter and debris that could migrate to habitat areas.
