**NOTICE:** Coastal sage scrub habitat has been listed by the County of San Diego as a sensitive habitat since the California Gnatcatcher (*Polioptila californica*) was listed as a threatened species by the Federal government in 1992. All projects that were approved prior to 1992 and impact Coastal Sage Scrub habitat on-site may be required to add additional mitigation measures or obtain a Habitat Loss Permit (HLP).

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
