



Heavy Duty Trucks

The San Diego County Air Pollution Control District (APCD) administers several state-funded grant programs to cover significant portions of the cost of replacing or repowering eligible equipment, which is then scrapped.

Grant applications are accepted for a limited time each year.

- When the grant program is opened, you can apply through the APCD [Citizen Access online application system](#), or for fleets of 10 or fewer trucks, you can apply to the streamlined Voucher Incentive Program (VIP) by contacting a [participating dealer](#).
- As the grant application window is limited, potential **HEAVY DUTY TRUCK** applicants may wish to gather legible electronic copies of the needed documents in advance:

General Requirement	Acceptable documents may include:
Anticipated costs of replacement engine or vehicle performing the same function as the existing unit	Written estimate (quote) from an equipment dealer documenting the cost of each piece of replacement equipment and—if applicable—retrofit device(s).
Certification level of proposed engine	CARB Engine Executive Order or EPA Engine Certificate of Conformity for replacement engine (from the equipment dealer)
Applicant certification of compliance with federal, state, and local air quality regulations	Grant Program Regulatory Compliance Statement , signed after the grant period officially opens.
Tax Forms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A completed current federal Form W-9 Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification, AND • A completed current California Form 590 Withholding Exemption Certificate
Description of the existing vehicle and engine	Legible photographs of 1) manufacturer's tag found on the door jamb of the existing truck showing VIN and GVWR and 2) engine serial number tag and 3), the emission control label (showing EPA family name)
Proof of ownership of the vehicle for the past 24 months and that there is no lienholder on the title.	Vehicle title for past 24 months
Proof of insurance of vehicle for past 24 months	Insurance cards for past 24 months
California registration for the previous 24 months	Eligible registration types including CA base-plated, CA-IRP, or dual-plated registration for trucks moving goods across the CA-

General Requirement	Acceptable documents may include:
	Mexico border; or DMV vehicle registration records showing at least 8 previous transactions at the DMV for your existing vehicle
Proof of vehicle usage documentation (miles driven) in California for past 24 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mileage logs • Hour meter records • Repair work orders • Fuel records <p>At least one mileage record showing current odometer reading (within 30 days of application submittal) and at least one odometer reading from at least 6 months ago</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any additional records demonstrating significant truck operation in a disadvantaged or low-income community in San Diego County (refer to the map to see if your routes include the colored areas according to the legend), or in a AB 617-designated community (refer to the map to see if your routes include the census tracts inside of the black borders)
Proof of compliance with the CARB Truck and Bus Regulation	"Compliance Status" printout from California Air Resources Board (CARB) TRUCRS or ARBER database for current year.
If active military service during the previous 24-month period prevents documentation of title, registration, usage or California operation requirements during the previous 24 months	DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty

Finally, if you are planning to apply for a grant, please keep the following recommendations in mind:

- DO NOT PURCHASE NEW EQUIPMENT YET! New equipment funded by this program can only be ordered or purchased once the contract is signed between the equipment owner and the APCD.
- KEEP EXISTING EQUIPMENT IN OPERATION! Existing equipment must be in operational condition. For heavy-duty trucks, the vehicle must be in operation at a similar activity level to that listed in the application until the equipment has been relinquished to an APCD-approved dismantler.
- STAY COMPLIANT! Equipment must remain compliant at all times with all applicable federal, state, or local regulations, and all applicable regulatory advisories, without the assistance of any grant funding requested in the application.



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
