
Need for Proposal



- Shipping Permit Agreements
 - Reduced need for travel
 - Combined inspections


Cost Savings

- Annual savings of \$80,000
- Without innovations, fees would increase on average by an additional \$2 or 2.8%


Innovations

- Increased operational efficiencies
 - Streamlined review process of certification
 - Streamlined compliance actions
 - Combined inspections

Cost Savings

- Annual savings of \$2,000
- Without innovations, fees would increase on average by an additional \$11 or 7.0%


Innovations

- Leveraging technology
 - Remote verification of hemp destruction
- Increased operational efficiencies
 - Streamlined sample Approval
 - Reduced advisory role

Cost Savings

 Total annual program savings of \$25K

Hazardous Materials Inventory Cost Containment

Innovations

- Increased operational efficiencies
 - Reassigned duties to Technician
 - Consolidation and reduction of facilities and inventory items
- Pesticide disposal events
 - Saved participating facilities an estimated \$108,000

Cost Savings

Annual savings of \$5,000

 Without innovations, fees would increase on average by an additional 2.0%
