RIGHT OF WAY WEED CONTROL AGREEMENT

Dear County Resident:

Anyone requesting that herbicides not be used along their right-of-way to a County maintained road must assume responsibility for controlling vegetation to the following standards:

Address and road segment description not to be treated:

- Pavement :** Bermuda grass must be kept away from pavement.
- Shoulder:** All vegetation must be removed from within 4' of the side of the road.
- Overhead :** Trees and shrubs must not interfere with traffic to a height of 14' 6" above the road surface and 4' to the side of any paving.

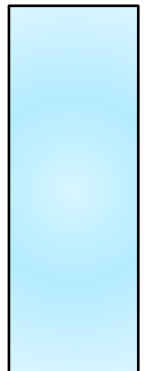

Roadside weed and vegetation control along County maintained roads serves several purposes. Visibility, fire fuel reduction, and clearance for driving are important because they affect the safety of those who use the roads, and are maintained through vegetation control. Pavement lasts longer when weeds and other plants along the roadway are controlled.

Since the early 1970s, roadside weeds have been controlled with herbicides along County maintained roads and walkways. Herbicides are the most efficient method of weed control. In some cases, herbicides are the only effective treatment. The use of herbicides is also four to five times less costly than other methods.

Along roads maintained by the County of San Diego, licensed staff from the Department of Agriculture, Weights and Measures perform the herbicide spraying. The herbicides they use are approved by both the U.S. and California Environmental Protection Agencies, and are of the lowest toxicity category rating. This means they present virtually no toxicity. Treated areas are safe to enter once they are dry. Landscaped areas are not treated.
