HHSA connects residents to a full range of essential services through six functional areas (also known as departments). These include:

Self-Sufficiency Services

Assists in providing individuals and families access to services that assist them in achieving self-sufficiency such as medical health insurance, supplementary food assistance and cash aid.



Aging & Independence Services

Protects older adults and people with disabilities from abuse and neglect and provides access to services that assist them to remain safely in their home.



Behavioral Health Services

Assists individuals and families, including those who are homeless, to achieve mental and emotional well-being that supports stability by providing access to mental health services, drug and alcohol prevention and treatment.



Child Welfare Services

Protects at-risk children from dangerous conditions and provides permanency and stability in living situations for children in order to enhance their overall well-being and strengthen families.



Public Health Services

Promotes health and wellness, healthy behaviors, and access to quality care; prevents injuries, disease, and disabilities; and protects against public health threats, such as foodborne outbreaks, environmental hazards and disasters.




Housing & Community Development Services


Provides housing assistance and community improvements that benefit low and moderate-income persons.
