Hi, CLERB. Thank you for the opportunity to comment. I am from zip code 92131 and my pronouns are she/her/hers. An article in today's Union Tribune addresses the tragic deaths of Saxon Rodriguez and Richard Eshbach after deputies failed to conduct proper safety checks. The article also notes that CLERB recommended the department, "take all necessary measures... to conform with statute and its own existing policies", which mandate

safety checks do not exceed 60 minutes and a shorter time window for people who are incarcerated and under medical and other special conditions. In short, the recommendation simply asks the Sherrif's department to do its job, as outlined by the department itself. This should not have to even go to recommendation, although I urge CLERB to continue to press on this front. What's more, I urge CLERB to request the SD County Board of Supervisors establish a timeline by which SD Sherrif's an Probation Departments must reply to CLERB recommendations. These tragic, preventable deaths speak to the urgent need for the Sherrif's department to uphold its own policies and, due to a historical inability to do so as outlined in this article, seek change recommendations from CLERB as soon as possible.
