POST Bias and Racial Profiling Refresher

Penal Code section 13519.4 mandates that every peace officer shall be required to complete a refresher course in Racial Profiling every five years, or on a more frequent basis if deemed necessary, in order to keep current with changing racial, identity, and cultural trends. This mandate can be satisfied by viewing the POST Bias and Racial Profiling (Multimedia ID 288) video on the POST Learning Portal. Due to COVID concerns, POST has suspended the requirement for follow-up facilitation with a certified Racial Profiling Instructor.

In order to complete the training, please click on the link below:

Log on to the POST Training Portal by clicking on the "Sign in with Pass" button.

Search for the course "Bias and Racial Profiling."

Click on "Bias and Racial Profiling" (it should be the top search result).

Click the blue "Start" button underneath "Overview" on the left side of the page.

Once you are in the course, ensure your browser is zoomed out enough so you can see the "I Acknowledge" button in the "terms and conditions" text box. If your browser is not zoomed out far enough, you can zoom out by holding down the Ctrl key and scrolling downward on the scroll wheel of your mouse. Click the "I Acknowledge" button and complete all six tabs of the training.

After completing the course, you must log back into LMS and sign off as completed. By clicking "Yes" to "Have you completed this activity?" in LMS, you are signing that you have viewed, read, and completed the training activity.
