

NAME: **LAKE CUYAMACA RECREATION & PARK DISTRICT**

LEGAL AUTHORITY: The Lake Cuyamaca Recreation & Park District was created by Senate Bill No. 1218, signed by the Governor on July 18, 1961. State Assembly Bill No. 2478 enacted April 17, 1963, and Senate Bill No. 198, Chapter 96 amending Article 6.1 (commencing with Section 105 of the Lake Cuyamaca Recreation & Park District Act (added by Chapter 1982 of the Statutes of 1963), to add Section 76.5 to Chapter 1654 of Statutes of 1961, and to add Section 5782.5.1 to the Public Resources Code (July 13, 1999).

MEMBERS APPOINTED BY: Members of the Lake Cuyamaca Recreation & Park District Board of Directors are appointed by the San Diego County Board of Supervisors.

MEMBERSHIP COMPOSITION: The district board shall consist of seven (7) members that are registered voters within the district.

TERMS: Four-year terms. Members shall hold office until their successors are appointed and qualified.

DUTIES: The district board shall establish rules for its proceedings..

The district board is the legislative body of the district and shall determine all questions of policy.

The district board may organize, promote, conduct, and advertise programs of community recreation; establish systems of recreation and recreation centers, including parks and parkways; and acquire, construct, improve, maintain and operate recreation centers within or without the territorial limits of the district.

The district board may co-operate with any city, county, district, state, or any subdivision thereof, or federal agency to carry out the purposes of this article.

The district board may, by ordinance, provide for a civil service system for employees of the district.

The district board shall keep a record of all its acts.

The district board may make and enforce all rules, regulations, and bylaws necessary for the administration, government, and protection of the property, improvements, and facilities under its management or belonging to the district.

NECESSARY FILINGS: Form 700, Statement of Economic Interests shall be filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors within 30 days of assuming office, annually thereafter, and within 30 days of leaving office.

MEETING DATE AND LOCATION: Regular meetings shall be held not less than once every three months. Regular and special meetings shall be called and conducted as prescribed by Sections 54953, 54954, and 54956 of the California Government Code.
