

NAME: **RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT OF GREATER SAN DIEGO**

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Division 9 of the Public Resources Code of the State of California Government Code Sections 1770 – 1782, 9044 – 9150, 9301 – 9317, and 54970 – 54975; Board of Supervisors’ Policies A-74, A-77, and A-134.

MEMBERS APPOINTED BY: Board of Supervisors

MEMBERSHIP & COMPOSITION: The Board of Directors for each Resource Conservation District shall be composed of five, seven, or nine members appointed by the Board of Supervisors from nominations as follows:

In-lieu of elections, the Board of Supervisors shall make appointments from a list of qualified applicants established by the Resource Conservation District where the vacancy has occurred.

Members of the Resource Conservation District’s Board of Directors must live in or be the designated manager of real property within the jurisdiction of the Resource Conservation District.

Members of the Resource Conservation District’s Board of Directors must have an interest in soil and water conservation.

Members of the Resource Conservation District’s Board of Directors must be a registered to vote in the County of San Diego.

The Resource Conservation District may require applicants to provide additional information as appropriate to enable the Board of Directors to make an informed recommendation to the Board of Supervisors.

Upon receipt of a list of applicants from the Board of Directors of a Resource Conservation District, the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall timely submit such list to the Board of Supervisors.

TERMS:

The term of the directors shall be for four years and shall expire at noon on the last Friday of November of even numbered years.

DUTIES:

Resource Conservation Districts work in conjunction with the National Resource Conservation Service to provide erosion control information to local land owners.

Resource Conservation District boards develop and maintain effective programs by identifying local conservation needs and priorities, setting goals and developing annual work plans.

Resource Conservation District boards administer the district by delegating tasks through a structure of board officers and members, committees, and staff.

Resource Conservation Districts coordinate programs, activities and services with other resource conservation districts/or related local, state, and federal agencies.

Resource Conservation Districts carry out the conservation district's mission by following the guidelines set forth in the bylaws.

Resource Conservation District directors shall have an interest in resource conservation, the necessary expertise to make informed decisions, the requisite time available, and be representative of the district population.
