The Political Reform Act, Government Code section 81000 et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC") has adopted a regulation, California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Division 6, Section 18730 (hereinafter "CCR 18730"), which contains the terms for a standard conflict of interest code. The terms of CCR 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the FPPC are hereby incorporated by reference and along with the attached Appendix A, in which designated positions and disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the conflict of interest code of Leon L. Williams San Diego County Human Relations Commission (Commission).

Designated positions shall file statements of economic interests with the County of San Diego Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

Overview

Commission Members are required to file a Statement of Economic Interest, commonly referred to as Form 700's, because they are officials who may make or influence government decisions. Filing the Form 700 provides transparency and ensures accountability to the public by disclosing an official's financial interests, ensuring decisions are made in the best interest of the public and do not benefit personal finances. It also assists officials in reminding them of potential conflicts of interest so that the official can abstain from participating in decisions that are determined to be conflicts of interest.

As the Commission is required to file Form 700s, it must first adopt a conflict of interest code. Attached is the proposed conflict of interest code. The proposed code requires full disclosures. Upon today's adoption, this code will be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for approval.
