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CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE Valley Center Fire Protection District

Adopted 02/15/2024

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix, Exhibit A, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the Valley Center Fire Protection District.

Individuals holding designated positions shall electronically file their form 700 statements of economic interests with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and file a printed, signed copy with the Clerk of the Valley Center Fire Protection District Board of Directors. The Valley Center Fire Protection District will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Sec. 81008) upon an official public records request. All statements will be retained by the Valley Center Fire Protection District for the term they serve the District plus 2 years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Valley Center Fire Protection District does hereby adopt the proposed Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on file with the Board Clerk and available to the public for inspection and copying during regular business hours;


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Conflict of Interest Code shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego for approval and said Code shall become effective immediately after the Board of Supervisors approves the proposed code as submitted.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF THE VALLEY CENTER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

EXHIBIT "A"

DISTRICT OFFICIALS WHO PARTICIPATE OR HAVE A MATERIAL EFFECT ON ECONOMIC INTERESTS AND OFFICIALS WHO MANAGE INVESTMENTS

The persons holding positions listed in the Appendix, Exhibit A, are designated employees for the purpose of electronically filing a statement of economic interest Form 700. It has been determined that these persons make or participate in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on economic interests or manage public investments:

Members of the Board of Directors

Fire Chief

Fire Division Chief

Fire Division Chief, Fire Marshal

This code does not establish any disclosure obligation for those designated employees who are also specified in Section 87200 if they are designated in this code in that same capacity or if the geographical jurisdiction of this agency is the same as or is wholly included within the jurisdiction in which those persons must report their economic interests pursuant to article 2 of chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Sections 87200, et seq. In addition, this code does not establish any disclosure obligation for any designated employees who are designated in a conflict of interest code for another agency, if all of the following apply:

(A) The geographical jurisdiction of this agency is the same as or is wholly included within the jurisdiction of the other agency;

(B) The disclosure assigned in the code of the other agency is the same as that required under article 2 of chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act, Section 87200; and the filing officer is the same for both agencies.

(C) Such persons are covered by this code for disqualification purposes only. With respect to all other designated employees, the disclosure categories set forth in the Appendix, Exhibit A, specify which kinds of economic interests are reportable. Such a designated employee shall disclose in his or her statement of economic interests form 700, those economic interests he or she has which are of the kind described in the disclosure categories to which he or she is assigned in the Appendix, Exhibit A. It has been determined that the economic interests set forth in a designated employee's disclosure categories are the kinds of economic interests which he or she foreseeably can affect materially through the conduct of his or her office.
