#### 6. **RECRUITING:**

Please describe your recruiting programs:

Election Systems Services Division: 30 volunteers were recruited to work election night. Of these 30 volunteers, 28 were regular/perm county employees recruited via the county's email system and 'word-of-mouth'. The remaining 2 volunteers were temporary/seasonal employees. Precinct Services: We recruit poll sites in various ways: Mail and phone communications with school districts, community college districts; personal in the field recruitment.

Election Services Division: Recruitment staff contacted over 16,000 poll workers via telephone, email and USPS mail to fill 5,635 poll worker positions and 280 Field Service Representative positions; this number includes the outreaching performed to state employees, local high school students, local college students and San Diego County employees. Appointment letters were sent

with assigned poll lcoations for Election Day and training was assigned to every poll worker.
