In 2020-2021 no formal recruiting efforts were made, but we added 3 new Emergency Disaster Volunteers to the team.

### 7. SPECIAL VOLUNTEER PROGRAM ACTIVITIES/ACHIEVEMENTS:

Please describe any special activities and/or achievements your program was involved in during the period of this report:

DAS provided disaster planning education to rural communities through 5 SDGE Wildfire Safety Fairs, 2 Firesafe Council Safety Fairs and 1 Fire Protection District Safety Fair, engaging both staff and volunteers in these activities in 2020.

During the Valley Fire 29 DAS employees, 30 DAS volunteers worked with volunteers and staff from San Diego Humane to evacuate and care for 354 animals at the receiving sites and 58 animals at the Red Cross shelters. The Bonita Shelter took in and provided daily care for 254 animals. DAS volunteers conducted 37 welfare checks on animals remaining in the field during the fire.

DAS staff and volunteers supported the Creek, Southern and Mesa Fires, and some smaller incidents this season.

DAS Volunteer Coordinator assisted Youth Probation evaluate and restructure their volunteer program 5 hours per week for 2 months.



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### 8. VOLUNTEER PROGRAM GOALS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-21:

Please describe your program goals. Include activities, number of volunteers, recruitment, training, recognition, and other goals:

The goal in 2021-2022 is to recruit 50 new Foster Families to provide day to day care in their homes for both cats and dogs, reducing in-shelter needs and creating advocates for pet adoption in the community.

In addition to Foster volunteers, DAS will recruit 50 new shelter volunteers. There are three primary groups of volunteers which are the Dog Pals, Cat Crew and Bunny Buddies. Volunteers in these groups are trained and mentored on how to safely interact and engage with the animals. Volunteers provide enrichment to animals throughout the day in the shelter environment. Volunteers also give much needed help with daily tasks at the shelter.

DAS will also recruit for an additional 28 new Emergency/Disaster Response volunteers in FY21-22, bringing the total target number of volunteers in this critical category to 100. The amount of online and field training necessary to prepare these volunteers for service is extensive, but their expertise and ability to deploy will support the department and the County in safeguarding the public for many years to come.
