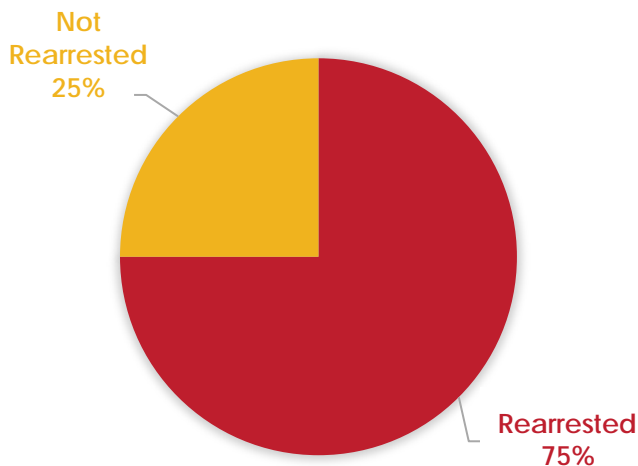


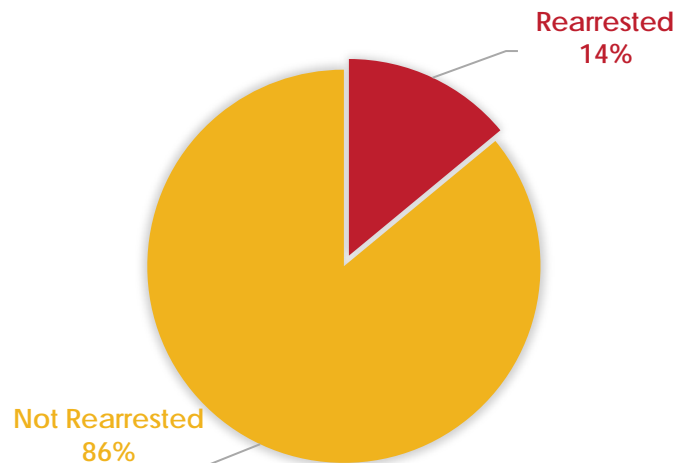
# **PALOMARPOWERED** Transitions. FROM CORRECTIONS TO COLLEGE

In a recent study, the Bureau of Justice showed that 75% of formerly incarcerated people were rearrested within five years. With an A.A. degree, that rate dropped to 14%. The Transitions Program builds bridges for currently and formerly incarcerated people to come to Palomar College and earn the kinds of degrees and certificates that build brighter futures—and keep people out of jail for good.
