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## BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS EXPOSURE CONTROL TRAINING PROGRAM EVALUATION

  - The types and uses of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as disposable gloves, including an explanation of the limitations of the equipment
  - The types of tasks, proper task technique, and order of tasks before and after putting on and removing PPE, to avoid contamination
  - The importance of hand hygiene and a demonstration of proper hand hygiene techniques
  - Choice, use, and storage of disinfectants and antiseptics
  - The signage required for biohazardous materials and the importance of properly labeling chemicals and supplies
  - Hepatitis B vaccine, including safety and accessibility
- Discussion of what constitutes a bloodborne pathogen exposure (BBPE) incident, including all of the following:
- Examples of BBPE, how exposure occurred, and actions necessary to prevent/minimize future exposures
  - Risk of infection following a bloodborne pathogen exposure incident
  - Procedures to be followed after an exposure incident, including medical followup
- Opportunities for interactive questions and answers with the instructor
