





- Services and Supplies
- Vehicles and Equipment
- Savings and innovation

Use of DEHQ Funds


- Reserve funds
 - Generated from operational cost savings
 - Restricted use
- √ \$1.1M one-time DEHQ funding offsets are included
- ✓ Without use of funds, fees would increase an additional 2.9%

Aboveground Petroleum Storage Act (APSA)

- Permit and inspect facilities with petroleum in storage tanks
- Update fee structure to incorporate changes to regulations
 - CCR Title 19
- Current fee structure: 5 levels
- Proposed fee structure: 2 levels
 - Simplifies structure for customers



Next Steps



Received and processed 683 calls at the CERS Help Desk








