Searching for Unified Program Facility Permits (UPFP)

1. Go to <https://publicservices.sdcounty.ca.gov/citizenaccess/>
2. Select the DEH (Department of Environmental Health) Tab



3. For Record Type, select Unified Program Facility Permit and zip code to get a listing of permitted (Haz Mat) facilities. Click on the Search button to get the listing. You may want to search by street name or a certain numbered block of the street for a more specific search.

For Proposed Child Care Facilities:

Pursuant to the City of San Diego Land Development Code, Section 141.0606, child care facilities must meet a hazardous materials buffer requirement of 1000 feet. To assist you in determining this, UPPF information is provided through our Citizen Access webpage. Please follow these easy steps to search for UPPFs

4. Compare the permitted Unified Program Facility (UPF) address with the proposed Child Care Facility address; use a map to approximate the distance of the UPF to the proposed Child Care Facility. If the UPF is 1000 feet or less from the proposed Child Care facility site, then list this in the Child Care Center Hazardous Materials Substance Approval Form, DS-527. This form is available at: http://www.sdcounty.ca.gov/deh/hazmat/pdf/hmd_child_care.pdf
5. Please send your completed Child Care Center-Hazardous Materials Substance Approval form, list of UPF within 1000 feet and a \$170 check for the review fee to: The County of San Diego - Hazardous Materials Division, P.O. Box 129261, San Diego, CA 92112-9261.

The review time is typically 1-2 weeks. The applicant will then be notified the review has been completed and the Child Care Center-Hazardous Materials Substance Approval form has been stamped. The stamped form will then be available for pick up and submitted to the City of San Diego-Development Services to continue the project.
